Workshop Objectives:

- state the distinguishing factor that differentiates the peripheral IV line from a central IV line;
- state the reasons why veins in the lower extremities and on the flexor surfaces of the joints are not routinely used as IV sites;
- discuss nursing measure that may be used to make a client more comfortable physically and emotionally prior to having an IV started;
- discuss various methods to promote dilation of the vein;
- discuss factors to be considered when selecting the IV site;
- list factors to be considered when selecting the type and size of the IV catheter;
- describe the aseptic techniques used when inserting and IV catheter;
- state the information documented regarding the IV start on the appropriate medical record form;
- discuss some common complications of IV therapy.
