Add Phlebotomy Skills Update - This **“hands-on”** workshop is designed as a refresher in phlebotomy skills for the practicing health care professional. Participants will have an opportunity to review and practice basic venipuncture techniques and will receive a competency checklist as well as a personal skills assessment. The class is offered for any practicing health care professional who has experience with venipuncture, but needs to review for competency purposes. It is offered several times per year as requested.

Add Infusion Therapy Workshop - This IV Refresher/Orientation course is offered to RNs and LPNs in response to the growing demand for an introduction to Infusion Therapy skills and/or as a “refresher” for those who need to update their skills. The classes are taught by members of the IV Therapy Department at Carolinas Medical Center. It is offered 4 times a year.

**Course Descriptions** (page 132) as printed, are updated with the following addition:

HUM 101: Music Appreciation, Credits: 3 (3 class), This course is an introduction to music in the context of the arts and society. Students will survey the position of music in selected cultures from around the world. Although music from the Western European “classical” tradition will be used for the purpose of analysis, many genres from various cultures and historical periods will be used including contemporary American idioms. Through this course students will gain a deeper understanding of the place of music in reflecting, shaping and critiquing society. Students will also learn how to listen to all kinds of music in greater depth.
